

Request for Federal TEACH Grant Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education 2023-2024

TEACH is intended for students who wish to pursue a career as a highly qualified (licensed) teacher in a high-need subject area, serving in a low-income elementary or secondary public or private school in the United States.

IMPORTANT NOTE: A student must sign an agreement to <u>serve or repay</u>. If you do not meet the requirements of your service obligation, all TEACH Grants you received will be converted to Direct Unsubsidized Loans. You must repay these loans in full, with interest charged from the date of each TEACH Grant disbursement.

To receive the TEACH Grant each academic year, you must:

- Be a U.S. Citizen or eligible non-citizen
- Be enrolled in a degree-seeking program
- Be completing coursework necessary to begin a career in teaching, or must plan to complete coursework necessary to begin a career in teaching this will be confirmed by the UM's School of Education
 - Meet one of the following to be awarded for the first time and for renewal eligibility:
 - Have at least a 3.25 GPA
 - -OR- score above the 75th percentile on an admissions test (SAT, ACT, GRE)
 - -OR- be a current/former teacher or retiree as noted in the section below.
- File a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at studentaid.gov
- Meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (see <u>https://finaid.olemiss.edu/sapterms/</u>)
- Complete a Federal Agreement to Serve (ATS) with the U.S. Department of Education (once awarded by Financial Aid)
- Complete online TEACH Grant counseling (once awarded by Financial Aid)

Annual awards are: \$4,000 for full-time enrollment, \$3,000 for ³/₄-time, \$2,000 for ¹/₂-time, and \$1,000 for less than ¹/₂-time. **Lifetime limits are:** \$16,000 for undergraduate study, and up to \$8,000 for an eligible master's program.
